2. Explain what IFR field school you are most interested in and why.

3. Describe any personal experiences and/or academic activities that have prepared you for a field school.

4. Illustrate how an IFR field school will contribute to your future academic or professional goals.

5. Please include anything else you would like the scholarship committee to consider while evaluating your application. Examples may include financial or personal obstacles you've had to overcome, barriers you've encountered to your education, examples of your ability to embrace new experiences, or other ways in which you may be a unique candidate.
